2017 Recognition Awards & QAVS Report

On Saturday, 21 October, more than 220 guests at Reach Society's 6th Recognition Awards celebrated the Society's national honour, The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service or QAVS (which is also known as the MBE for volunteer groups) which was won last June. This was a historic achievement because Reach Society became the first social enterprise, led by a team of male professionals in the Black community, to win this national honour.

The Society's Patron, Professor Sir Geoff Palmer welcomed everyone to the Society's signature event; and three Deputy Lieutenants of Greater London - Mrs Mei Sim Lai, OBE; Thomas Chan and Piers Storie-Pugh, OBE – spearheaded the QAVS celebration.

Professor Bill Leahy, Deputy Vice Chancellor, Brunel University London, gave a heartwarming tribute to the Society for winning this national honour. He reminded the audience that this is the highest honour available to any voluntary group. The keynote speaker Rene Carayol, MBE, the founder and CEO of Inspired Leaders Network, congratulated the Society for the work it is doing with young people; and highlighted the importance of taking responsibility for ourselves in order to make the community more robust and resilient.

Another Patron, John Budu-Aggrey, the founder of Alpha BSE Training, presented the Society's 3 founders and members of the management team with QAVS badges in recognition of their outstanding leadership of the Society since 2010; and for winning their historic national honour.

The Group Chairman of Grace Foods, Don Wehby; and the MD of Grace Foods UK, Adam Reader, presented a recognition trophy to **Rio Reveira**, who became the first recipient of the **Grace Foods and Reach Society Scholarship** for a British young men of Caribbean background who enrolled at Brunel University London in September. This new scholarship package covers the funds needed to pay all tuition fees for Rio's first degree; it provides a paid internship during a summer break; access to the mentoring programme at Brunel University London; and the offer of employment with Grace Foods on graduation.

History was also made when four Champions Awards, sponsored by Victoria Mutual BS were presented to Dr Ashton Barnett-Vanes, Dr Nira Chamberlain, Paula Roque, and Ritchie Neil. All were extraordinary contributors to the inspirational work of the Society with young people, over many years.

Four employers - Brunel University London, Grace Foods UK, KPMG, and the RAF - won the Corporate Champion of Reach Society awards for their contributions as outstanding collaboration partners of the Society. Brunel UL and Grace Foods are the funders the new scholarship package; the RAF has sponsored a set of 12 Fellows Awards for professionals who have demonstrated exceptional support of the Society; and KPMG has engaged fully in every large event rolled out by the Society in the last 12 months.

Dean Blackstock became the fourth recipient of the Index of Cultural Esteem (ICE) Books Reader Award which is sponsored by Alpha BSE Training. It is awarded each

year to a young adult for reading a few of the books shown in the list of ICE Books (see the ICE Books page on www.reachsociety.com).

Continued close collaboration with the Caribbean Women's Standing Conference culminated in their presentation of an achievement award to Pius Abitegeka, a final year undergraduate at Brunel UL, who has been the face of the university in many outreach events.

Each of the guest presenters John Budu-Aggrey, from Alpha BSE Training; Mei Sim Lai, OBE, DL; Piers Storie-Pugh, OBE, DL; Thomas Chan, DL; Adrian Burns, Air Commodore, RAF; Leighton Smith, CRO, Victoria Mutual BS; Cynthia Eubanks, OBE; and Daniel Norris, City & Islington College also paid tribute to the many award winners for their compassion and for reaching back to connect with and inspire our young people.

On the night several professionals, slightly less than 20, were honoured with Supporter of Reach Society awards for their unselfish work on 4 April for reaching back to encourage, motivate and inspire roughly 1000 young people, and their parents, at the 6th Careers Conference that was rolled out at the Royal National Hotel in Russell Square.

Five professionals – Betty Joseph-McIntosh, Pastor Trevor Adams, Paula Neil, Rianne Palmer, and Sonia Palmer - picked up Fellow of Reach Society awards for their sustained high levels of contribution to Reach Society. Betty led the Council of Leaders (the COL) as the executive director with distinction; and Pastor Adams served on the COL Trinity for 3 years. Paula, Rianne and Sonia continued to play central roles in the last Careers Conference and outreach events.

Corporate Supporter Awards were picked up by two employers the Ministry of Justice and Southside Young Leaders Academy. In addition, six corporates picked up Corporate Fellow of Reach Society awards for their exemplary commitment to the work the Society is doing to inspire young people. They are Alpha BSE Training, High Speed 2, Kick It Out, London Black Teachers' Network, Network Rail and Victoria Mutual Building Society.

There were four employers who achieved Corporate Champion of Reach Society awards namely: Brunel University London, Grace Foods UK, KPMG and The RAF. This is the first time these corporates have won this distinction.

This report would not be complete without an expression of thanks to the master of ceremony, Rob Neil, for his skillful and timely handling of the programme, and to Leslie Primo for his candid, reflective interlude which touched everyone who heard it. The Society is also grateful to the Ralph Lewars Jazzmen and the DJ Ray Morris crew for keeping everyone in the right mood.
