Reach Society in the Community: Covid-19 and Vaccination Awareness Discussion: A panel consisting of Health



Professionals and Scientists spoke to pupils, staff and parents/guardians of Newman Catholic College; and answered questions primarily from pupils about this subject matter. Perhaps the first of its kind, giving young people the chance to raise questions concerning Covid-19 and the vaccine. Headteacher Mr Danny Coyle commented, "I was delighted with this event and received positive feedback from several staff members and pupils."

Windrush Day Thanksgiving In The Family; The Society's approach in celebrating cultural esteem: On 22 June 1948, the SS Empire Windrush arrived at Tilbury Docks in London and since 2018 we have marked this special anniversary as Windrush Day, and to celebrate the contributions of the Windrush generation and their descendants to the UK. Since 2019, the Society has been urging the Black community to celebrate this day with family and friends on the first Sunday after Windrush Day to come together and share stories of life in the UK as a part of *Windrush Day Thanksgiving In The Family*. Encouraged by one of our patrons Prof Sir Geoff Palmer who commented that: "Windrush Day Thanksgiving Gatherings could become for the Black community as significant as St Patrick's Day for the Irish or Burns Supper for the Scottish." In response Reach Society has chosen to be the catalyst for spreading the



idea of Windrush Day Thanksgiving Gatherings via local groups or hubs. To help in this process we have recently published a booklet: 'Our Guide for Celebrating Cultural Esteem: Windrush Day Thanksgiving Matters.'
